
PHSP AT A GLANCE

The goal of USAID's Public Health Sector Project (PHSP) is to reduce the burden of public health diseases in Ethiopia. PHSP supports the private health sector to expand availability of high-quality health services and strengthens their capacity to take a prominent role in the prevention and treatment of priority public health diseases in Ethiopia:

- Strengthen an enabling environment to engage private health facilities to deliver public health services
- Expand access to quality health services at an affordable cost
- Institutionalize an integrated and sustainable private health care system
- Enhance program learning and innovative ventures for the private sector



PHSP KEY ACHIEVEMENTS



Developed Public-Private Mix Implementation Guidelines for TB, FP/MNCH, and malaria to ensure quality service provision by private facilities.



Engaged 862 private health facilities to provide improved priority health services such as FP, HIV, malaria, MNCH and TB, <mark>to more than 2</mark> million patients.



Networked more than 300 private facilities to the national laboratory sample transportation system and External Quality Assurance program to improve diagnostic services.



Effectively dialogued with public agencies to provide private facilities access to free supply of essential drugs and vaccines.



Facilitated the **approval of 32 loans** by two private banks to private health facilities, through the Development Credit Authority scheme, to increase access to HIV and TB services, bringing the total number of approved loans to 86 for a total value of \$11.4 million.



Trained over 3,600 health staff from private health facilities to improve quality of care.
